

WHO WE ARE

Both the Classified and APT councils are made up of dedicated staff members who care about UAA and want to ensure that it continues to be a great place for both employees and students alike.

Classified Council is composed of 24 members of the classified staff (hourly – non-exempt).

APT Council is composed of 15-members of the APT staff (salaried - exempt).

Both councils include representatives from Mat-Su College, Kodiak College, Kenai Peninsula College, and Prince William Sound Community College, as well as a general membership of representatives from the Anchorage area campuses.

Representatives of both councils are elected in April and serve a two-year term. Nominations are solicited via email every spring and self nominations are encouraged.

Council meetings are held on the first Thursday of the month during the academic year. Audio call-in is available for all meetings.

All meetings are open to the public and employees are encouraged to attend.

OUR MISSION

The mission of the APT Council is to serve as the voice of administrative, professional, and technical staff, and serve as a center for input and dissemination of information. The council provides opportunities for concerns and recommendations to reach the appropriate channels for consideration.

The mission of the Classified Council is to serve as the voice of classified staff, representing and advocating their concerns throughout the university community. The council is a resource for inquiries and requests from employees and strives to engage and educate classified employees and make them an integral part of the University community.

UA SYSTEM GOVERNANCE

The UA governance system is established by the University of Alaska Board of Regents Policy 03.01.01. It provides a forum for staff to raise issues of concern to the University which may be discussed and acted upon.

Every year, we advocate for new and existing policy changes to address our concerns and those of our fellow staff members.
