The UAA School of Education annually conducts satisfaction surveys. The surveys provide faculty with data addressing the satisfaction of program completers and their employers with the relevance and effectiveness of their preparation.

Employer satisfaction surveys were administered in the Spring of 2019, 2020, and 2021 seeking stakeholder feedback on advanced-level program completers from 2018, 2019, and 2020, respectively. The survey administration with performed in collaboration with the Center of Alaska Education Policy Research, an independent research unit of the Institute of Social and Economic Research.

The Advanced Licensure program faculty have developed new Alumni/Employer Survey tools to be piloted with AY 2020-2021 completers in Fall 2023.
